

JESUS OFFERS MORE THAN CAMELOT

Based on Psalm 68:1-10 and John 17:1-1

In the last scene of the musical Camelot, King Arthur spins out a song filled with memories of what had been the most idyllic place on earth. Alone on stage, the broken, but forgiving King Arthur begs us to remember:

"Ask ev'ry person if they've heard the story, And tell it strong and clear if they have not, That once there was a fleeting wisp of glory Called Camelot!"

In Jesus final prayer for his disciples before his betrayal, arrest, denial and crucifixion, he offers them – not an idyllic life, but the assurance that he will be present with them always. Jesus also prays that they "will be one" and live in unity/harmony with God and with each other. Jesus wants the same for each of us.

<u>UPDATE ON OUR FOOD ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS</u> - As we continue to try to meet the need for food for many of our community neighbors we have members of our faith family who are using donated "Food Pantry" funds to purchase non-perishable foods (canned fruits and veggies, cereal, pasta, pasta sauce, beans, peanut butter and jelly, etc. and volunteers handing our bags of groceries to community neighbors on Tuesday afternoons and Sunday evenings. We are also handing out and delivering "snack packs" – bags with ready to eat or easily microwaveable single serving items - for folks who have limited access to cooking facilities, limited cooking ability, are homeless and families with children who may have to get their own meals when parents are at work. The following or like items are needed for these snack packs. If you purchase items and would like to have them picked up, contact one of our Pastors.
