Imagine a young man — call him Timothy — who has just finished his education and is headed out into the real world. He's bright, talented and loaded with potential. Our culture will encourage Timothy to dream several dreams. We live in a culture that pursues happiness instead of spiritual contentment. And, Timothy, like the rest of us, needs to find contentment in what we have: ENOUGH. The world's dreams aren't the same as God's. The world needs more of the sweetness of Christ.

Paul warns us that "those who want to be rich fall into temptation and are trapped by many senseless and harmful desires" (1 Timothy 6:9).

Where are you TEMPTED and TRAPPED?

Christian discipleship, like athletes, requires training and sacrifice. *Is it time for more athleticism on your part? What is holding you back?* Think about what tempts you away from Jesus. Consider what traps you and holds you back from following God.

Fight the good fight of the faith. Take hold of the eternal life to which you were called when you made your good confession in the presence of many witnesses. <sup>13</sup> In

the sight of God, who gives life to everything, (1 Tim. 6: 12-13a)

"Amazing Grace" according to singer Judy Collins, is a song about letting go, bottoming out, seeing the light, turning it over, trusting the universe, breathing in, breathing out, going with the flow; timing is everything, trust your instincts, don't push the river, ease on down the road, get on your knees, let your guard down, drop your defenses, lighten up, like angels they know how to fly, don't be afraid, when all else fails, pray; there are a million ways to say it. If we don't, we crack up, break our heart.-Singer Judy Collins' explanation of what the hymn "Amazing Grace" means, quoted in Critique, April 2000, 15.

Grace, as Collins' describes and Paul fleshes out in his coaching of the young Timothy involves forceful verbs: fleeing, pursuing, fighting, taking hold of Christ, letting go of harnesses, and being SET free.

The key issue to note is that Paul is not recommending happiness, but contentment. Happiness is an emotion; a state a person can be in. The Bible uses the word *descriptively* in 24 of its 25 usages. Contentment, by distinction, is a trait — the language of *being* coming from the lexicon of the soul. The Greek word for "contentment" carries with it the notion of sufficiency — "enoughness." It implies satisfaction, and the Bible uses it *prescriptively*. In other words, people can be happy, but they should be content. This makes Paul's commendation to Timothy one of encouraging a spiritual discipline: "Young Timothy, in the face of a culture of money lovers, choose to be content. Choose sufficiency. Choose satisfaction. Choose 'enoughness."

WHERE are you content? Where are you experiencing the reality of the good life in, the sweet life, in following God/Jesus Christ? Salute de la dolce vita. Cheers to the sweet life...

1 Timothy 6: Verse 21 wraps up the good life in Christ: taking God's Good News to the world.

Our call to Stewardship: being content with what God is already doing in our lives and being eager to share the Good News with all we meet!

### **October Session Highlights**

**Communion:**. The Lord's Supper was received by 87 people at our worship service on September 4, by 14 people at the Primrose service on August 14, and by 12 at the Primrose service on September 11.

**Personnel Change:** Elder Debby Howland, Chair of Personnel Team, presented a motion that Rev. Tagliaferre's employment contract not be renewed after its natural expiration date of October 31, 2022. There was discussion following Pastor Joe's presentation, a quorum was confirmed, and the motion passed. Pastor Joe has vacated his office, turned in his keys, and will not have any further Interim Associate Pastor duties through the end of his contract on October 31, 2022.

**New Church Directory:** Our church Administrative Assistant, Jaymee Toebben, will work with Unique Church Solutions by Universal Church Directories to produce a new pictorial directory for FPC. There will be no cost to the church. Each person/family unit photographed will receive a free 8 x 10 and a free directory. Photograph appointments will occur on Weekdays and Saturdays with no photos on the Sunday Sabbath.

Downsizing the Session and Board of Deacons: The Board of Deacons and the Session will each be reduced to twelve members. Deacons and elders serve three-year terms. Because of the number of members who will have time remaining on their terms at the end of 2022, the Nominating Committee will not have to find any new deacons or elders until the end of 2023. The downsizing reflects a shift since covid of in seat and Livestream worshippers, the number of members compared to 2002 (deaths and people moving out of the area), and the significant number of visitors we have each week (who cannot serve as deacons or elders until they become members). The Nominating Committee for 2022, which will do their work in the fall of 2023, is comprised of: Rev. Angela D. Madden, Katherine Best, Ruthie Caplinger, Jim Hofmann, and Anne Schneider and a Deacon delegate (to be selected by the Deacon's board) and an Elder Delegate (to be selected by the Session in 2023).

**Visitors and Children:** A look at our attendance records for this past year shows a significant number of visitors who are with us every Sunday, some of them on a long-term basis. We also have a good-sized bunch of children (52 children ages birth through high school) who are attending functions at our church. Visitors and children can become new members down the line.

**Replacing the Ceiling in the Sanctuary:** The Facilities Committee got FPC's plaster ceilings examined by a Autenrieb Church Painting, company skilled in plastering (this is a relatively small group of providers). The company has offered some possibilities, but we can't move forward until we resolve the issue of coverage with our insurance company.

**Next Meeting:** The Session meet again on October 11.


Our snack dinner was "walking tacos" and we walked from the church to Adrian's Island.

#### Peru Missions

Throughout the year the church has sent funds to Medical Mission Inc (MMI), our partner in missions in Peru. Most recently funds were sent to purchase medical equipment and supplies. Some of the funds come from our church budget; but many of the funds come from restricted gifts from our congregation as well as from the congregation of Middle Octorara Church in Pennsylvania.

Nurse Margarita Diaz Seminario reports that she and the hospital staff continue to work under difficult circumstances. They are currently using a temporary hospital while the new one is being built. There have been many delays and concern with misappropriation of funds for the hospital. It may be 3 more years before the new hospital is complete. There is a great need for hospital equipment now, but a need to ensure items purchased will be taken to the new hospital when completed. They are involving hospital staff and the director to prioritize needs. They've purchased hospital nightstands; mattresses to prevent pressure sores; wheelchairs for various departments; stretchers; bedpans; and some neonatal equipment.

Margarita shares that the neonatal equipment will be used to detect congenital cataracts and cardiac anomalies in newborns. One of the photos below is of a baby with a heart problem, helped by this equipment. She believes they will be able to solve these problems with the help of this equipment.

She also shared a story of a young man who is a nurse, who was injured when hit by a truck in March. He was hospitalized in serious condition, but is getting better. This was a young man with little financial means and he needed a wheelchair. They were able to provide him with one (see photo below). Of course, without this wonderful partnership with MMI and Margarita, we would not be able to participate in God's mission work in Peru. She says their hearts rejoice - and of course, ours do too!

### Common Ground 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary

Common Ground celebrated their ten year anniversary with staff and volunteers during a dinner on September 23<sup>rd</sup>. Common Ground is a community service organization that provides innovative and relationship focused strategies to address needs for those experiencing poverty in our community. It is located at 1015 East Atchison in Jefferson City.

First Presbyterian Church has provided financial support to Common Ground through mission giving, since its inception. We also have continuously supported Common Ground with congregational members serving on the Board of Directors and as volunteers. Nell Hawes-Davis currently coordinates our volunteers with Common Ground and Scott Johnston is our representative on the Board of Directors. In 2021 Common Ground provided over \$123,000 in assistance to 734 families in our area, and successfully referred many to other services in the community to meet basic needs.

Funding for Common Ground is largely supported by church partners, (53% in 2021) and other governmental and private sources, including individual donors, local businesses and community organizations.

Services provided by Common Ground focus on temporary financial assistance and professional resource counseling to families in the Jefferson City Public School District. This aid includes utility assistance, rental/deposit assistance and gas vouchers/ bus passes for critical transportation needs. Other types of assistance are determined on a case-by-case basis. In its 10 year history Common Ground has earned a reputation as a trusted and effective resource for our community.

#### REQUEST FOR PRAYER

Brethren in the Lord,

The word assures us in Isaiah 55:6 that we should seek the Lord while He may be found and call upon Him while He is near and in Ps 145:18 The lord is near to all who call on Him, to all who call on Him in truth.

The above verses have prompted me to come to you with a plea that together we should seek the Lord because of the situation that I and many other Malawians are in at the moment.

Our Malawi is caught in a very hard vicious cycle and as days pass by things become worse which I feel I need to share with you so that you may stand with us in prayer.

The past growing season has seen the country without enough food supplies According to an IPC Chronic Food Insecurity Report, approximately 5.4 million people in Malawi living in rural and secondary urban centers are facing Moderate or Severe chronic food insecurity. Other reports are indicating that close to half of the Malawi population is in dire need of food. The cause has been attributed to recurrent shocks and hazards, particularly floods and prolonged dry spells; poor livelihood strategies; poor policy implementation and high poverty levels. This cycle is prone to continue because of the rise of fertilizers. Last year fertilizer rose by 80% and this year another 30% and we are told it will continue to rise. This clearly shows that most Malawians of which more than 70% live below the poverty line cannot afford it.

We have had a 25% currency devaluation and since then we have seen a rise in all commodities. The commodities are rising almost on a weekly basis to the extent that when we are trying to source quotations for procurement, we are only given a few days for the quoted prices.

There is a recurrent electricity blackout since January where we have been in the dark for 8 to 12 hours and this has adversely affected the hospitals whereby we have to rely on fuel dependent generators to supply electricity in the hospitals. This has been costly beyond

explanation as the price of fuel is also exorbitant. Last week, we were also informed that they were switching off one power plant for 15 days for repairs which has increased the length of the blackouts and load shedding.

Since last month, the country has been experiencing severe fuel shortages and vehicles have to be on long queues to get fuel. At the time the pumps are dry, we resort buying fuel from the black markets to run ambulances and generators and the cost of this is almost double the pump price. We are not managing and it is becoming harder by the day.

As if the above are not enough, since last month we also have a cholera outbreak, last week in the whole Northern Malawi we did not have Intravenous fluids to resuscitate people with cholera. We are buying the IV fluids from Lilongwe which is the Central Region and this has further increased the cost due to the addition of transportation costs.

This is where I feel that, the complex problems of Malawi cannot be dealt with by human endeavors. We need to seek the face of God otherwise we will perish. This faith of mine which is as small as a mustard seed tells me that God is above all our struggles and when we go to him, He hears our prays and He can save us. Please stand with us in prayer for the following:

- 1. That we can have wisdom to deal with the problems highlighted above
- 2. That we can be able to cope and be able to assist the people under our care
- That the situation should not affect us adversely
- That we can find solutions both long term and short term to deal with the problems which we are facing.
- 5. That Malawi like any other country can enjoy the God given life.

I always thank God that I have people whom I can turn to, who can stand with me in all situations. May God be with us as you support me in prayer.


### Did You Know & What Can You Do? From the Social Justice Ministry Team



Did you know that fresh water algal blooms have increased in the last few decades and are a problem in all 50 states? In addition to runoff carrying fertilizer into streams and lakes, higher temperatures increase algal blooms. Some algal blooms, like red tides in oceans, are toxic to aquatic life and humans.

We can reduce the causes of harmful algal blooms by reducing the nutrient pollution we are unintentionally causing. We can reduce the amount of chemical fertilizer we put on our lawns and gardens and reduce the runoff that carries it from our property. Don't run sprinklers until water runs down the gutter to the storm drain that goes directly to streams. Pick up after your dog and dispose of his waste in the toilet. Use compost on your plants because it will give both nutrients and organic matter to the soil in your garden. Using compost on your soil will keep carbon dioxide in the soil and not in the atmosphere. Plant trees, especially on slopes, to reduce runoff, take in carbon dioxide, and release oxygen.

And pray for those impacted by climate change, in flooded areas, wild fire zones, drought stricken farmers, and in heat wave zones.
